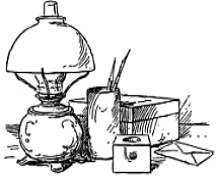

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

In my letter on the weekend of June 20-21, I mentioned the process for those who wish to receive the Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church, the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. In that letter I mentioned how important it is for all of us to share our faith with others, not knowing the impact it might have. This is uncomfortable for some of us for a number of reasons. There has to be a balance on how we approach this, being obnoxious about it is one extreme and not doing it at all is another extreme.

Right now, it appears we have 5 individuals (2 men and 3 women) who are going to be involved this year (beginning September 7th) in the process of the RCIA (The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). Two (2) will be Catechumens preparing to be baptized, receive First Communion, and be confirmed. Three (3) will be Candidates (1 who is already baptized in another Christian denomination preparing to make a Profession of Faith to the Catholic Church, receive First Communion and be confirmed, and 2 who already have been baptized Catholic and have received First Communion preparing to be confirmed).

This year, we are probably going to have to begin our sessions on Zoom.

I meet individually with each interested person in order that we get to know each other and to explain the process. In light of my comments above about sharing our faith, I would like to share what two of the ones I met with this week shared with me.

One of the "to be Catechumens" (alias Joe) told me he had a business associate (alias Pete) who each time they had a meal together, Pete asked Joe if Joe minded if he said a prayer before the meal. Joe related that Pete would at times ask other individuals who shared concerns with him if it was OK if Pete prayed for them. This is one of the things that has affected Joe to receive the Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church.

A "to be Candidate" (alias Bob) shared with me he grew up in another Christian denomination, was very active in it but fell out of practice. He recently has been talking to a Catholic friend about the friend's faith. Bob is now taking the steps to become Catholic.

I share these 2 stories to reiterate how important it is in a balance and healthy way to share our faith with others. We never know how God may be using us and the effects it may have on another.

If you know someone who you think might be interested in the RCIA process, talk about it with that person, encourage him or her to view the "Becoming Catholic" page on our website where the person will be able to learn more about the process and will be able to hear firsthand the experiences of others who have taken part in this process. Then, if the person is interested, have the person get in touch with me.

On another note, this week the Augustinians celebrate two of the most important dates on our Augustinian liturgical calendar, the feast of St. Monica on Thursday, and on Friday the feast of St. Augustine, the patron of our Order and obviously the patron of our parish. Hopefully, we might spend time on these days reflecting on perseverance in prayer, being able to search in our restlessness for truth and being willing to change from any sinful ways. May we ask both St. Monica and St. Augustine to intercede for us asking for God's blessings on our parish and in particular with the ramifications of the pandemic.

Lastly, at the 11:00 Mass on Sunday, September 6th, we will have an opportunity to thank Fr. Bill Donnelly (the elder Fr. Bill) for his services to the parish during my absence last year. I will say more about this in next week's letter.
