

**The Third Sunday of Advent

**Gaudete Sunday**

The day takes its common name from the Latin word Gaudete ("Rejoice"), the first word of the introit of this day's Mass.

On Gaudete Sunday rose-coloured vestments may be worn instead of violet, which is otherwise prescribed for every day in the season of Advent. Gaudete Sunday was also known as "Rose Sunday."

In churches that have an Advent wreath, the rose coloured candle is lit in addition to two of the violet coloured candles, which represent the first two Sundays of Advent. Despite the otherwise somber readings of the season of Advent, which has as a secondary theme, the need for penitence, the readings on the third Sunday emphasize the joyous anticipation of the Lord's coming.



## *A word from Fr. Bill...*

Dear Parishioners:

There are three parish committees on which I rely a great deal in my responsibilities as pastor of St. Augustine Parish, namely the Parish Finance Commission, the Steering Committee of our Capital Campaign and our Parish Pastoral Council.

The Parish Finance Commission (PFC) which meets once a month oversees the preparation and implementation of the yearly parish budget. Each month, the members receive an updated finance report and a projection for the next several months. They advise me on projects and capital improvements for our facilities and grounds. They just compiled an employee handbook recommending procedures and policies for parish personnel. They receive regular updates on the activity of the Steering Committee of the Parish Capital Campaign. Its members are Rosemary and Jerry Lorenz, Ferdi and Ruth Luyun, Gerry Rigby, Tim Babbage, Jacob Marquart, O.F.S. and myself.

The Steering Committee of the Capital Campaign has been meeting once a month since 2017 overseeing the parish's Capital Campaign. In Phase I of the campaign, we have received 98.7% of our goal of \$750,000. The committee directed the projects for which this money has been used. Please see the Capital Campaign page of our parish website for more specific information. Also, in Phase 2 of the campaign, the committee has been overseeing the request of grants from various foundations. Now, the committee is spearheading the effort to establish the St. Augustine Heritage Foundation and a 501(c)(3) status for this newly formed foundation. Rene Quinlan, Fran Richards, Gerry and Kathy Rigby, Melissa Huggins, Tim Babbage, Jacob Marquart, O.F.S. and I comprise the membership of this committee.

The purpose of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), which also meets once a month, is to advise me on the pastoral needs of the parish. The directives of the Archdiocese state, "The purpose of the Parish Pastoral Council is to foster full participation of the entire parish in the life and mission of the church which reflects the mission of Christ who was sent 'to bring glad tidings to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind and release the prisoners.'"

The general function of the PPC is to consult with me on the pastoral concerns of the community. Each month I ask them what do they hear that I don't hear. They recommend, and evaluate procedures, and programs which would help the parish in the areas of worship, spirituality, community, evangelization, education and service.

Right now, the PPC is in the process of developing a 3-5 year pastoral plan for the parish. We are doing this in collaboration with an outside resource, based on the findings of the survey in which our parish participated last spring. Stay tuned for the development of this exciting project.

Each month the members of the PPC get an "update" on the financial and administrative aspects of the parish. It is important for them to have this information in order to share it with other members of the community, as needed.

In general, an important function of the PPC is to inform me of pastoral needs of the parish and to inform parishioners of developments in the parish. Keeping this in mind, it was recently observed by the council that many parishioners may not know who the members of the PPC are or how to reach them. Their names and email addresses can be found on our parish website on the page which gives information about the ministries and the councils in the parish. Members of the PPC who serve three year terms will be introduced to the community at each of the Masses this weekend: Brian Halpin, Bob and Cathy Schuck at the 9:00 AM Mass, Sally Corpuz, Agnes Amora, Lala Borres, and Gene Poligrates at the 11:00 AM Mass, Bill and Maureen Castro at the 7:00 PM Mass. Kim Barroso, our Director of Music and Jacob Marquart, O.F.S., our Director of Parish Services, serve as staff resources to the PPC.

I am extremely indebted to all of the members of these committees. I truly would not be able to function in carrying out my duties as pastor without their consultation.


