

Gaudete Sunday

The day takes its common name from the Latin word Gaudete ("Rejoice"), the first word of the introit of this day's Mass.

On Gaudete Sunday rose-coloured vestments may be worn instead of violet, which is otherwise prescribed for every day in the season of Advent. Gaudete Sunday was also known as "Rose Sunday."

In churches that have an Advent wreath, the rose coloured candle is lit in addition to two of the violet coloured candles, which represent the first two Sundays of Advent. Despite the otherwise somber readings of the season of Advent, which has as a secondary theme, the need for penitence, the readings on the third Sunday emphasize the joyous anticipation of the Lord's coming.



A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

In one of the Penitential Rites at Mass, we pray Christ has come, Christ is here and Christ will come again. In the first two weeks of Advent our liturgies direct us to look forward to the Second Coming of Jesus. In last Sunday's scripture readings, Baruch, St. Paul and John the Baptist were all telling the people with whom they were communicating to look beyond their problems of exile and other hardships as Christ will come again and the crooked roads will be straight.

This weekend and next weekend, we are asked to reflect on the first coming of Jesus. We know Jesus is not going to be born literally again as he was two thousand years ago. But, we are going to celebrate with great fanfare the fact that he was born over two thousand years ago. We are going to celebrate that God loves us so much he took on our flesh. He became one with us and was like us in everything but sin.

In the midst of a lot of hectic days, may we not lose the opportunities to reflect on what we truly are celebrating on December 25th.

How can we do this?

May we take a scripture passage each day and reflect on God's unconditional love for us as expressed in the gift of Jesus.

May we take use of the beautiful sacrament of Penance and celebrate that Jesus came to forgive us our sins.

May we make amends with someone with whom we have difficulties as Jesus prayed that we may be one as he and the one who sent him are one.

May we list the ways we experience Jesus comes to us regularly between his first coming and second coming.

May we take a few minutes each day and think of what would our lives, personally and collectively, be like today if Jesus was not born two thousand years ago.

It is easy to go thru the next several of weeks mechanically: send the cards, receive the cards, get the gifts, receive the gifts, put up the lights, buy a tree, bring the tree out of the attic, decorate the tree, go to parties and on December 26th take a deep breath and get ready for the next holiday.


There is an old saying that states "Jesus is the reason for the season." How will we make it a point to remember that? Because of the challenges of our society, may we use some of the suggestions I made above or come up with our own to keep the focus of what the gifts, cards, trees and meals are all about.

These next two weeks are an opportunity to truly prepare to celebrate the first coming of Jesus, the fact that he was born two thousand years ago and what the ramifications of that are for me individually and us collectively.

I pray that in my own life that the next two weeks will not be mechanical and that I am not just going thru the motions.
