





*A word from Fr. Bill.....*

Dear Parishioners:

Although it may have been different from other years, I hope your celebration of Jesus' birth was a good one. Because of the pandemic, the accidentals of how we celebrated Christmas this year may have been different from other years but hopefully, the essence of our celebration was the same. No matter what, the reality is God became one with us. We often use that expression but hopefully we can ponder that reality and grow in our appreciation of what that means. It means God was like us in all things but sin. God got tired. God got hungry. God got frustrated. God felt forsaken. God felt pain. God felt the loss of loved ones. Jesus in becoming human experienced everything we experience. Why? So that you and I can have the opportunity to be with God forever. We lost that because of sin. By Jesus' birth that relationship is able to be restored. There is only one basic mystery in our faith and that is God's love for us. Hopefully, the lights we continue to see on our trees and homes will remind us that by Jesus' birth he brought us from darkness into light. Having said that, we are grateful for the positive things which happened in the calendar year that ends this Thursday. We are grateful that people made many sacrifices and adjustments during these challenging days, e.g. those in the medical world, our scientists, our teachers, our public health officials, our public safety officials, and all those who put the common good above their own good.
