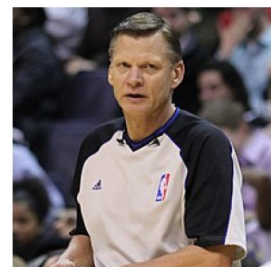

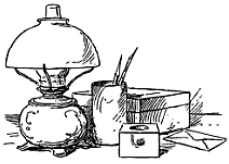

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

As you know, this Sunday is the First Sunday of Lent. In my letter last weekend, I mentioned a number of different opportunities for prayer, fasting and almsgiving to help us prepare to renew our baptism promises at Easter. One of those opportunities is participating in our Tuesday night discussions on the Sacraments. I mentioned last week that I would say more about it this week.

There has been a flyer in the bulletin for the past several weekends informing you of our parish Lenten program. Once again, please find enclosed within this bulletin (or attached to this email) the same flyer describing the program, discussions on the Sacraments of Healing (Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick) and the Sacraments of Commitment (Holy Orders and Matrimony).

This is similar to the program we as a parish facilitated in Advent. In the Advent series when we discussed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), we had about 30 participants each of the three weeks. Although we were pleased with the participation, there were not many participants from our parish. To be honest, this is for whom this program was designed, as a follow up to the parish evaluation which took place in February/March 2019 facilitated by the Catholic Leadership Institute and in which over a hundred of our parishioners took part.

This evaluation indicated many positive things about the parish, e.g. being a welcoming, and inclusive community which encourages participation of our parishioners, to good homilies, to good music, etc. But it also indicated that it would be good for us to provide a means for our parishioners to know more about the basics of the Catholic faith. Thus, the initiative of this program entitled "Everything you always wanted to know about the Sacraments but were afraid to ask."

Another thing which surfaced from our 2019 parish evaluation was how reluctant our parishioners are to share their faith. So now, we have an opportunity for you to do just that. On the other side of this flyer (or attached to this email), please see the comments of those who participated in our Advent series. Please share the enclosed (attached) flyer and comments with others and/or forward the flyer which you will find also on the homepage of our parish website.

As you review the guest participants for our Lenten series, you will notice that there are representatives of the hierarchy, laity, the diaconate, diocesan priests and religious life. It was important to us to have a good variety of guest participants.

If you are going to participate, you need to register (different link for each week). After you register, you will receive notification that you are registered and you will receive a reminder as we get close to the discussion each week.

You also may be interested to know that each session will be recorded and available on our parish website.


I am very grateful to the committee who has met on Zoom about 30 times since last May. Each member of the committee has made significant contributions to the final product: deciding the substance and the logistics to update our parishioners on the faith, the name of the effort, suggestions for guest participants, design of the flyer, handling all the details with the technology involved, advertising the program, etc. etc. The committee members are Dan Petrongolo, Bill Castro, Jacob Marquart, O.F.S., and Maria Roberts-Reyes. After each of our Tuesday meetings, a number of us joined other parishioners saying the rosary. This truly has been a collaborative, consistent, committed and prayerful effort.

The program is certainly open to people beyond our parish. Matter-a-fact, most of the participants in Advent were from outside the parish, virtually from different segments of the Archdiocese which you can see from the comments.

It goes without saying that we are grateful to all of our very qualified guest participants for this Lenten series, and in particular to Archbishop Perez who is going to lead off the series on Tuesday, February 23rd, discussing the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

We hope you will join us for as many sessions as possible in order to grow in the knowledge of the faith or to become renewed with it, and that you also will take an opportunity to share our faith by inviting others to participate in these five sessions.
