

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

In my letter this weekend, I would like to bring to your attention some various interesting things going on in our parish community.

First of all, I have been informed that one of our parishioners, Michael Fox, has achieved First Honors at Father Judge High School where he is a Senior. Congratulations, Michael.

I also would like to acknowledge some parishioners who have been serving our parish community very faithfully and quietly behind the scenes for the past several months. Back in May, I asked if any parishioners would volunteer to sanitize the pews after each Mass on the weekends. No one thought that this need would last as long as it has. In the name of the community, I would like to thank Bill and Maureen Castro (9:00 AM Mass), Ollie Lopena and members of the Filipino community (11 AM Mass), and Dave and Sue Ryan—and at times their children, Connor and Mary (7:00 PM Mass). We are very grateful for this very valuable contribution. It gives parishioners a sense of comfort as they come to Mass knowing the pews are regularly being sanitized.

Since September, two young men have been meeting with me and Patrick Lanza on Zoom every Monday night as part of the process for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Steve Rainstein is a Catechumen, preparing to be baptized, receive First Communion and be confirmed. John Wilson is a Candidate. He was baptized Lutheran and is preparing to make a Profession of Faith to the Catholic Church, be confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time. At the 7:00 PM Mass last Sunday, they participated in the Rite of Election. The Rite of Election always takes place on the First Sunday of Lent in every cathedral in the world. Because of the pandemic, Archbishop Perez directed this ceremony to take place in the individual parishes this year. It was a great opportunity for the community to meet Steve and John and become familiar with what they are doing and it was a great opportunity for Steve and John to experience the community at worship. Part of the RCIA process are little prayer services called “Scrutinies.” There are three Scrutinies as part of the process which take place on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sunday’s of Lent. Scrutinies are a time we look at ourselves carefully and examine ourselves thoroughly. This is exactly what Steve and John are doing as they reflect on the special Gospels of those Sundays. These are going to take place at the 9:00 AM Mass on Sunday, March 7, the 11:00 AM Mass on March 14 and the 7:00 PM Mass on March 21st. Please keep Steve and John in prayer as they continue this journey and may we all scrutinize ourselves as we prepare to renew our own baptismal promises. I am extremely grateful for Patrick Lanza’s faithfulness in representing the community and participating weekly in this process


