



A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

As was announced in my letter last weekend, Brett Schneider and Lindsay Waqar who were both baptized Lutheran made a profession of faith to the Catholic Church, were confirmed and received the Eucharist for the first time at the 7:00 PM Mass last Sunday. They and their sponsors met with Fr. Bill Donnelly and Patrick Lanza during the past year. You will see a picture of this group in the insert of our parish bulletin this weekend. You will find other pictures of this great occasion on our website. Press the link "Becoming Catholic."

As I said at the Mass last Sunday evening, they deserve a great deal of credit, making this step at this time in the Church's history. It shows a great deal of conviction and commitment on their part. They provide an opportunity for all of us to reflect on what we may take for granted, being Catholic. What difference does it make? I assured Brett and Lindsay of our support for them as they continue on their journey of faith with us.

The process they experienced is called "The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)." The preparation goes from September to Pentecost, usually the beginning of June. During this time, every aspect of our faith is covered, various liturgical rituals take place, including a ceremony with Archbishop Perez at the cathedral on the First Sunday of Lent. They are formally welcomed into the Church at Easter (except during a pandemic).

As of right now, we have three people who are seriously interested in beginning this process in September, two who are not baptized at all (Catechumens) and one who was baptized in another Christian community (Candidate).

Do you know anyone interested in being part of this process? Many times people will say I would be interested but no one ever asked me. Many people have the interest but they have to be encouraged. Jesus said we are salt and light. Maybe you would be the salt that makes another thirsty for the faith. Maybe you would be the light to someone else's darkness. You are in contact with people whom I perhaps would never see. You may make an incredible difference in someone else's life.

For whom is the process? It is for adults who are not baptized at all. It is for individuals who were baptized in another Christian religion. It is for baptized Catholics but who never received Communion and were not confirmed, and for baptized Catholics who have received First Communion but who were never confirmed. Do you know anyone who fits into any of these categories and may be interested in being part of the process of RCIA. If so, encourage them to learn more about this process by checking out the "Becoming Catholic" link on our website. One will find there a description of the process, pictures of those who have been involved in the process in the past six years and most importantly videos in which past Catechumens and Candidates share their experience of the process.

Think about if God wants to work thru you as salt and light to someone else's journey of faith.
