

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

This past Tuesday, I attended a gathering with four other priests to become more familiar with Project Rachel. What is Project Rachel? It is an office within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia that helps women (and men) with issues after having an abortion. We talk so much about why abortion, taking the life of a child in the womb, is wrong. But, we don't always share the information to let people know of the resources (e.g. places to stay, doctors who will help with examinations, baby clothes and furniture) which are available to help those contemplating an abortion or to let people know what resources are available to help people to heal after they had an abortion. There are books on the book rack in the back of the church which provide a great deal of information concerning resources which are available.

There also are many resources in the Archdiocese to help people after an abortion has occurred. After an abortion, there is often guilt, pain, shame, and confusion, etc. Sometimes people feel that God would never forgive them, or that they would never be allowed back in the Church, or that others would never forgive them or that they cannot forgive themselves.

There is nothing that separates us from the love of God. God doesn't love us to one degree one day and to another degree another day. God is always present, caring, loving and forgiving. We just need to be open to it. Remember celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday a few weeks ago? Remember the Gospel last week of the shepherd's care for the sheep? Remember the story of the father waiting with open arms as the prodigal son returned? Remember Jesus telling the woman caught in adultery "Neither do I condemn you?" This Sunday we hear Jesus saying, "Do not let your hearts be troubled."

The primary way we experience Jesus' love and forgiveness is in the Sacrament of Penance. Some people may remember when abortion was considered "a reserved sin," meaning only a bishop could absolve someone who had an abortion. This now has been extended and all priests can absolve someone who has had an abortion. Some may think they are excommunicated from the Church because they had an abortion. This never applied to someone who was under 16, had the abortion out of fear, unaware of this law, felt forced to have the abortion, etc. Regardless, the Church welcomes back all of us who have sinned at one time or another.

The Church, the faith community, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia does not want someone who was involved with an abortion to think they have to deal with this issue alone. This is why Project Rachel exists. It reaches out to all women and men hurting emotionally and spiritually after abortion. This ministry helps heal wounded relationships with oneself, the child, and God. Extending God's compassion, unconditional love and forgiveness, Project Rachel offers hope and peace. Again, that someone would know they are not alone in dealing with the ramifications of abortion, there are retreats, professional counseling opportunities and support groups available to help in the healing process. There are retreats in the area called Rachel Vineyard Retreats. They are sponsored by the Immaculata Spiritual Center, Daylesford Abbey and the National Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in Doylestown.
