



A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

As you very well know, this Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. It will be celebrated this year dramatically different from that to which we are accustomed. For starters, most of us will not be having turkey with a great number of family members. I may have dinner, just the two of us, with my sister. This is a far cry from other years when there are maybe 20 of us together for Thanksgiving dinner. The other friars will not be with their families either. I imagine most of you will have the same experience.

We just experienced a challenging election season. We all are living with the restrictions and ramifications of the coronavirus pandemic. It is easy to lose focus of the total picture. For me, that is why it is so prudent that we have a civil holiday to help us put everything into focus.

The Gospel that is usually proclaimed at Mass on Thanksgiving is about the healing of the ten lepers where one came back and said "thank you." Were the other 9 lepers ungrateful? I don't think that is necessarily the case. My guess is that they were so excited for the high priests to verify that they were healed and that they could be reunited with their families, go back to their jobs and associate with their friends again that they didn't see the whole picture. Understandably, their focus was somewhere else. Can't that happen to us? Even more so when we are experiencing a number of negative things!

Maybe we can make it a point this Thanksgiving, which will be very different for all of us, to do two things. One, be committed each day to list in writing 3-5 things in a journal for which we are grateful. They call this a "Gratitude List." This can help us see the broader picture rather than seeing just what is happening in the here and now. It helps us not to develop a negative personality and consequently interact with people in a cold fashion. The reason for writing them in a journal is so that we can go back and remember them. The second thing we can do is on a regular basis make it a point to tell someone something for which we are grateful. We all need to be affirmed. We all need to hear something positive about ourselves and to know we are appreciated. Even Jesus in his humanity did.

We need to keep things in perspective and to see a total picture. A friend of mine has been struggling for many months with a detached retina. He has had several operations. He has had to lay on his stomach for hours. He is not able to work to the same degree he could before. He told me a few weeks ago he saw a blind man crossing the street with the help of others. Bill told me he was truly grateful he is able to do as much as he can. That is putting things in perspective.

We have Mass on Thanksgiving Day at 10:00 AM. Hopefully, you can join us. If you cannot be with us physically, the Mass will be LiveStreamed. Please join us virtually. You can make connection on the homepage of our parish website.

In the midst of many challenges, let us give thanks to God for his infinite love, that he forgives us over and over, and that he gave us his Son, Jesus so that we could have eternal life with him. May we also list the things for which we are grateful that are particular to each of us. I put into that category for myself the gratitude I have for the support (letters, cards, emails, phone calls, text messages, visits, etc.) which I received in the year I was away. Be assured that will be brought to the table of the Lord on Thanksgiving Day.

Have a SAFE week and a wonderful Thanksgiving. I hope your turkey isn't burnt.

Dear Parishioners:

As you know, because of an increase in COVID 19 cases in the Philadelphia area, the city of Philadelphia has issued new directives for indoor activities in the city. Also, we received a communication from the Office of Divine Worship of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia concerning the city's directives.

As a result of these two communications, we had a special meeting on Zoom of our Parish Pastoral Council on Thursday evening to develop a plan for St. Augustine Parish.

First and foremost, our primary goal is to maintain a safe environment for everyone to worship. In order to accomplish this, we have developed the following plan. In addition to LiveStreaming the 11:00 AM Mass each Sunday, for the foreseeable future we also will LiveStream the 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM Sunday Masses. Because we are directed to moderate the size and density of our congregations, we looked at the proposed formula for attendance based on the square-footage of our space. Our "magic number" is approximately 35 people. For the foreseeable future, we will use this as a guide for our Masses.

We also are reminded "that the Archdiocesan directives for sanitation, face coverings and masks, as well as, social distancing are to be assiduously observed."

I would like to remind you that Archbishop Perez has removed the obligation to physically be present for Mass. He also has encouraged the elderly and anyone with compromising health situations not to come to Mass. For those in these situations, it certainly is encouraged to find other ways "to keep the Sabbath holy." For example, watching the Mass virtually (go to our parish website for the link), reading the scriptures, and praying with family members would be ways of doing this.

I am very grateful for the consultation of our Parish Pastoral Council in helping to develop a plan for our parishioners to worship in a safe environment in midst of the increase of cases locally of the coronavirus.

Please be assured of our prayers for you during these unprecedented and challenging times.



Let us pray,


