


2021 Mass Book OPENING

Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006)



As of yesterday, October 10th, we have a new "Blessed" on his way to Sainthood. His name is Carlo Acutis and he was only 15 years old when he died in 2006 in Milan, Italy from a short illness with leukemia. He attended Mass and prayed the rosary everyday of his life. He was noted for his cheerfulness and for his computer skills as well as for his deep devotion to the Eucharist which became a core theme of his life. The calls for him to be beatified began not long after he died and gained significant momentum in 2013 after the cause commenced and he became titled as a Servant of God - the first stage on the path towards sainthood. Pope Francis declared him to be Venerable on 5 July 2018; the same pope approved a miracle attributed to him which enables Acutis to be beatified. He had asked his parents to take him on pilgrimages to the sites of all the known Eucharistic miracles in the world but his worsening health prevented this from happening. Being passionate about computers led Acutis to make a website dedicated to careful cataloging of each reported miracle and he did this in 2005 (he had cataloged each case since he was eleven). 

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

This past Saturday, October 10th, was a very celebratory day for our Augustinian Community as two of our friars through the imposition of the hands of Archbishop Nelson Perez received the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Dan Madden was ordained a priest and Elizandro (Eli) Contreras was ordained a deacon. Dan is presently serving as a Deacon at Merrimack College and Eli is finishing his theological education in Chicago. We are very grateful to God that they both have responded with God's grace to serve the Church in this way. Dan will return to Merrimack where he will begin his priestly life and Eli will return to Chicago and serve as a deacon during his final preparation for priesthood. We thank God for their calling and we thank Dan and Eli for generously responding to this call. May God bless both of them with their new roles within the Church.

As you know, here at St. Augustine Parish we have a special second collection usually on the third weekend of each month for "Community Outreach and Fellowship." This collection started about 6 years ago when members of our parish community began to serve at Gift Of Life Family House at 4th and Callowhill Streets which is within our parish boundaries. Gift of Life Family House is a residence for patients preparing for and recuperating from a transplant operation or as they say a "home away from home for transplant families." We have two teams in the parish, one who serve on the 2nd Sunday each month and one that serves on the 3rd Tuesday each month. These teams prepare a menu, shop for the food, prepare the dinner and serve it to the transplant residents and their families. Your generosity continues to allow the transplant patients and their families to experience a homemade meal. I wanted to let you know that this ministry continues (with some adjustments) during these pandemic days. I am very grateful to Jerry and Rosemary Lorenz (Tuesdays) and Jane O 'Connor (Sundays) who have been coordinating these teams since we began this ministry 6 years ago and certainly extend our appreciation to all those who serve on their teams. Thank you to all our parishioners who help this ministry to continue during these challenging days. Because the 3rd Sunday of October is Mission Sunday, this collection will be taken up this weekend, the 2nd weekend of the month. Thank you for your help.

At our monthly Augustinian community meeting (House Chapter) last Monday, we discussed the topic of homelessness in our area. We recognized how complicated this issue is, but at the same time recognizing our responsibility to the men and women in our area who are homeless. Although these are individual responses, not a communal response, 2 suggestions surfaced. The first is for each of us to clean out our bureaus and closets and give away all the clothes which we do not use, not ones that we need but ones we do not need. St. Augustine says that if we hoard the clothes we do not need, that we are stealing from the poor who do need them. The second suggestion was that we purchase a certain amount of "things" (e.g. \$25 a month) and give these toiletries, snacks, etc. to the homeless during the month. Once these things are given away in a month, we wait until the next month to do the same thing. I share these ideas with you in case you may want to incorporate them into your own lives. If anyone has any other suggestions, please let me know.

As you may have read, last Sunday in Assisi on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis issued a new encyclical entitled, "Fratelli Tutti." I not yet have read the encyclical but I understand that the Pope's central point is that in order to respond to the many wounds in our society (poverty, human trafficking, war, terrorist attacks, lack of dignity and rights of women, racial and religious persecution, the plight of migrant workers) we need to return to God and develop a fraternal social friendship, seeing ourselves as brothers and sisters responding together to the challenges of our world and in particular how the world will be designed after the pandemic. His emphasis is that fraternity and social friendship are the ways to build a better and more peaceful world. If anyone would like to be part of a discussion of this encyclical, please let me know and we will try to find a mutually convenient time to read and discuss it.

As you will read elsewhere in this bulletin, Monday is Columbus Day. We will celebrate Mass as we do on all legal holidays at 10:00 AM on Monday and not at 12:05 PM.
