As you may have seen in recent bulletins, a **"PHISHING"** scam has been affecting a small number of parishes within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. **WE ARE ONE OF THEM!** This scam involves

parishioners receiving a text message, email, or a phone call from a source alleging to be the pastor of the local parish (**the email address may look VERY similar to Fr. Bill's or a staff member's email address**). These messages contain a request for parishioners to purchase gift cards for a parish fundraiser or some other reason and then send the gift card numbers back to the scammer claiming to be Fr. Bill. Very often the language is requesting you to make contact right away because it is "very important." **This is something we will NEVER do, so BEWARE!**

If you are unsure of a request that you have received, please call the Parish Office **FIRST BEFORE** you do anything.

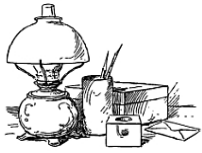

A word from Fr. Bill.....

RCIA at St. Augustine Church

When my "spiritual father" Augustine, was sitting quietly in a garden in the Milan, Italy, he heard a voice that invited him "Take up and read." Inspired in that moment Augustine picked up a bible. He read a passage from St. Paul's letter to the Romans and realized that it was addressed to him, encouraging, even demanding that he change his way of life. The moment of encounter with **God's Voice** led him to begin a journey of his heart. Some months later he was baptized by St. Ambrose on Easter Sunday in 386. For years his mother, Monica "hounded" him to become a Christian, a hound from heaven, one might say.

I know that as a member of Augustine's spiritual family, I have procrastinated, **ran way** at times from the "voice" that invites me to respond to Christ, most especially God Merciful Love. "Leave me alone" is often my response, certainly not a model response but "who wants to be a model?" When Augustine at his best moment heard a voice that invited him to join the others who were Christians, he knew that it was time. Knew that it was time to pursue what he had wrestled with from his earliest days. What Augustine discovered is that he could no longer procrastinate, the wrestling was over.

If there has been a "**Voice**" inviting you to join the Catholic Faith Community, we at St. Augustine Parish would be honored to journey with you as you prepare through a formation class to become a member of the Roman Catholic Community. The formation process is known as the **Rite of Christian Initiation** or the **RCIA**. As an introduction to the rich traditions and teachings of our Catholic faith, it includes weekly gatherings for educational presentations and reflection. Our time together concludes with the great feast of Easter when everyone sings the "Easter Alleluia."

Participants may include those who are not yet baptized and those who are baptized in another Christian Faith community and have a desire to join the Roman Catholic Church. My personal take on the **RCIA** course of formation is that it is one of the jewels of our Church. When mature men and women reflect and pray together in a journey like the Exodus of the Old Testament, there is a point of arrival. Arrival not at a Promised Land but at an oasis of water where one has a taste of the Goodness of the Lord. The Goodness is expressed in Christ's Easter greeting to his disciples - "Peace Be with You."
