

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

I mentioned in my letter last week that I was going to have a Zoom meeting with members of the Filipino community. I wanted to do this in order to discuss some of the effects of the Coronavirus. St. Augustine Parish is the National Shrine of Santo Niño. Many people would come to the Sunday 11:00 AM Mass because of the way the choir enables this liturgy as well as the fellowship experienced at the meal which took place immediately after Mass each week. Because of the pandemic, we can have neither of these, the choir nor the meal, at this time.

In this light, I met on Zoom with about 12 members of the Filipino community this past Saturday. Some of the things we discussed were:

- Even though we cannot have the choir, we can have more music in Tagalog.
- At the generosity of Rick Camitta, one of the owners of Camitta Brothers, our parishioners are permitted to park in their parking lot at the corner of 4th and Vine Streets. It was observed that many parishioners do not know this and that we need to make this fact better known.
- We should resume saying the Novena to Santo Niño after the 11:00 AM Mass each week. We did start this this past Sunday.
- We need to have preparation for new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors and review how they are scheduled each week.
- We need to actively invite more people to participate in the 11:00 AM Sunday liturgy, especially some of the younger professional members of the community. Some at the meeting agreed to make this effort.
- We need to start preparing for the Simbang Gabi, a novena of nine Masses in different parishes preparing for Christmas. Traditionally, the first of these Masses on December 15th has been celebrated here at St. Augustine. We need to start making arrangements for this.
- We need to make sure that all the good works accomplished by Lita Manguba do not get lost. We agreed that these can and will be distributed within the community.

I am grateful to all those who participated in this Zoom meeting. As you can see, it was very productive.

On another topic, something that I have mentioned before: some people have received emails supposedly from me asking for help. The latest is even sent with my picture. They are not from me. Please look closely at the email address. Anyone can create any email address to resemble another. The ones supposedly from me alter my legitimate email address. This is called phishing. My only email address is: pastorstaugustine@gmail.com. There are no numbers within it. Please do not respond to the falsified ones. I know one person responded by sending a \$300 gift card. I am always grateful, for the generosity of parishioners, but I would never ask for something in this way. Please be careful.

Finally, I would like to express our gratitude to the Catholic Foundation of Greater Philadelphia for the gift of \$2,000 to help with the cost for the equipment that enables us to LiveStream our liturgies. The cost of this equipment was approximately \$15,000. We also have received donations of approximately \$6,200 to offset this cost. We have received memorial donations in memory of my brother, Peter, who died last month that will help pay for this project as well. In addition, we are expecting some other donations. If anyone would like to make a donation to help with this expense, please be in touch with me. At the Parish Finance Commission meeting this past Tuesday night, the members began a conversation concerning the possibility of the parish receiving revenue by making LiveStreaming available for weddings, funerals and baptisms.
